SUBJECT: Warrior Primary Care

1. PURPOSE. This Directive, in accordance with the authority in References (a) through (d), establishes policy to describe relationships and provide guidance to Joint Task Force National Capital Region Medical (JTF CapMed) Medical Treatment Facility (MTF) Commanders and Center Directors in balancing the Service-specific requirements for primary care of Wounded, Ill, and Injured (WII) Service members with high-priority needs of other eligible beneficiaries.

2. APPLICABILITY. This Directive applies to JTF CapMed Headquarters (HQ), Walter Reed National Military Medical Center (WRNMMC), Fort Belvoir Community Hospital (FBCH) and the Joint Pathology Center (JPC).

3. DEFINITIONS. WII Service member:

4. POLICY. It is JTF CapMed policy that:
 - a. Regardless of the requirements for specialty care, comprehensive primary care services will be provided to all Warriors from the initial treatment phase through the transition of returning to the force or to civilian life.

b. The activities of the Warrior Care Clinic shall be under the auspices of MTF or Center for purposes of licensure and accreditation.

c. Access to care shall be equivalent for all Active Duty WII Service members, regardless of Service affiliation.

5. RESPONSIBILITIES

a. Commander, JTF CapMed. The Commander, JTF CapMed, shall act as a resource and intermediary for issues related to operations and resources of the Warrior Care Clinic.

b. MTF Commanders and Center Directors. MTF Commanders and Center Directors shall:

(1) Ensure that the operations of the Warrior Care Clinic meet the requirements of JTF CAPMED-I 6025.04 (Reference (e)).

(2) Ensure that personnel of the Warrior Care Clinic meet the credentialing and privileging requirements specified in Reference (e).

(3) Ensure that personnel of the Warrior Care Clinic have access to professional and personal development opportunities.

(4) Ensure that quality of care is consistent for all WII Service members, regardless of Service affiliation.

(5) Consistent with Office of the Surgeon General/Medical Command Policy Memo 08-028 (Reference (f)), ensure that access to care is consistent for all WII Service members, regardless of Service affiliation.

(6) Develop mechanisms to use available resources of the Warrior Care Clinic to meet high-priority needs of eligible WII beneficiaries.

(7) Ensure that the Warrior Care Clinic has adequate representation on relevant boards, committees, etc.

6. INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS

a. The following record keeping systems will be maintained:

(1) Composite Health Care System coding of Active Duty WII Service members will be consistent with DoD Directive 6040.41 (Reference (g)).

(2) In accordance with subsection 12.0 of Section 1 of Chapter 6 of Section 1 of 51-M of the TRICARE Operations Manual 6010 (Reference (h)), and regardless of Service affiliation, all WII Service members will be enrolled to special Health Care Delivery Programs code 415 (Warrior Transition Unit), code 416 (Community Based Health Care Organization), or other code as appropriate.

b. The following are additional information requirements: With the exception of Service-specific required record keeping, Active Duty WII Service members will be tracked via systems that are approved by JTF CapMed, that are compliant with the DoD Information Assurance Certification and Accreditation Process, and that are consistent across the Joint Operations Area.

7. RELEASABILITY. UNLIMITED. This Directive is approved for public release and is available on the Internet from the JTF CapMed Web Site at: www.capmed.mil.

8. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Directive is effective immediately.
