SUBJECT: Military Personnel Drug Abuse Testing Program

1. **PURPOSE.** This Directive, in accordance with the authority in Reference (a), establishes policy and clarifies responsibilities for the implementation and management of the Joint Task Force National Capital Region Medical (JTF CapMed) Drug Abuse Testing Program for all assigned or attached military personnel.

2. **APPLICABILITY.** This Directive applies to JTF CapMed and all Joint Medical Treatment Facilities and Centers in the National Capital Region (i.e., Fort Belvoir Community Hospital (FBCH), Walter Reed National Military Medical Center (WRNMMC), National Intrepid Center of Excellence (NICoE), and the Joint Pathology Center (JPC)).

3. **POLICY.** It is JTF CapMed policy to:

- a. Use drug testing to deter Military Service members from abusing drugs, including illegal drugs and other illicit substances.

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b. Use drug testing to permit Commanders to detect drug abuse and assess the security, military fitness, readiness, good order, and discipline of their commands.

c. Use drug testing as a basis to take action, adverse or otherwise (including referral for treatment), against a Service member based on a positive test result.

4. RESPONSIBILITIES

a. Command Group, JTF CapMed Headquarters (HQ). The Command Group, JTF CapMed HQ is responsible for implementing and enforcing a drug abuse testing program in accordance with DoD Directive 1010.1, DoD Instruction 1010.16, and DoD Directive 1010.4 (References (b) through (d)) for all military personnel assigned or attached to JTF CapMed HQ to include the JPC. Overall management of drug abuse testing for covered personnel will be provided by Navy Medicine National Capital Area as outlined on page 21 of attachment 1 of the Support Agreement (Reference (e)).

b. Commanders of the WRNMMC and the FBCH. Commanders of the WRNMMC and the FBCH, working through their respective Deputy Commander, Readiness & Operations, are responsible for implementing and enforcing a drug abuse testing program in accordance with References (b) through (d) for all military personnel assigned or attached to their command. Military personnel assigned or attached to NICoE, which is organizationally aligned to WRNMMC, will be included in WRNMMC's drug abuse testing program.

c. Military Service Members. All military Service members assigned or attached to JTF CapMed or a Joint medical treatment facility or center under the operational control of JTF CapMed will participate in a drug testing program.

5. RELEASABILITY. UNLIMITED. This Directive is approved for public release and is available on the Internet from the JTF CapMed Web Site at: www.capmed.mil.

6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Directive is effective immediately.
